Roles and Responsibilities of a Senior Counselor:

Must be at least 18 years old and/or have camp or related experience. Responsibilities include:

- Delegating and overseeing C.I.T.'s
- Being promptly on time in the morning
- Assisting campers at lunch
- Changing diapers
- Changing campers in and out of clothing and swim wear
- Assisting and taking part in all camp related activities
- Being familiar with and meet camper's needs
- Managing campers throughout all camp programs
- Maintaining an open line of communication with the staff as well as with campers and parents
- Abiding by all camp rules and regulations
- Initiating campers in emergency procedures
- At the end of the camp season, being able to assess and make suggestions for the following season
- Ensuring campers are supervised at all times
- Providing various experiences and activities for campers including songs, games and Storytelling
- Comforting the campers from being away from home
- Establishing routines and provide positive guidance
- Providing a safe and secure environment for children to feel comfortable
- Implementing positive discipline when required
- Clearly and effectively communicating in a manner that children understand
- Observing children and make note of progress
- Ensuring equipment and the facility are clean, well maintained and safe at all times
- Providing weekly schedules of activities related to the themes of the week
- Preparing and set up the classroom daily and clean up the classroom daily
